


PARKS BROCHURE


The City of Aberdeen has approximately 200 acres of developed land within the city limits for community use.

GARLEY PARK

This South Aberdeen neighborhood park has a playground and a multi-use sports field.





This neighborhood park includes a “fun for all” playground, picnic shelter, basketball court, disc golf course, and tennis courts.




JAMES STEWART MEMORIAL PARK

Destination park with a large picnic shelter, playground, and a 1 mile long nature trail.



PETERSON PLAYFIELD

This neighborhood park offers a playground, a multi-purpose sports field, basketball court and a picnic shelter.

Sitting along the Chehalis River, you'll find a playground, walking trail, river bank and pier for fishing, and the Rotary Log Pavilion.




PIONEER PARK

FINCH PLAYFIELD

This popular neighborhood park is home to a spray park, basketball court, playground, and a multi-purpose sports field.

Passive park at the east entrance to the city. You'll find statues, veteran memorials, and seasonal holiday trees and lights.
